Lyerly Spring Clean-Up – Clerk Sally Kerce said that she has had several people ask about having a Lyerly clean up day. We don't have the manpower or equipment to go around and pick up at peoples houses but when Josh Wyatt was mayor, we once had a roll off dumpster put on the Ragland buildings gravel lot and allowed people to dump their stuff into it. We could do that again for a short period. Juanita Baker said that we could try it one weekend and the next week see how it goes. If no one uses it, we won't do it again. Gwen Fisher and Shirley Davis asked what the cost would be. Sally Kerce said that Wright's would bring the roll off and then every time it has to be dumped, it would be \$150 plus the cost for the weight of trash. Mike Wright said that Trion does it and does the same week each year. Shirley Davis asked Michael Cabe's opinion and he said that he was for it. Shirley Davis said we could do it maybe the middle of April. She asked about the week after Easter. Michael Cabe said people may want to clean up before Easter. Gwen Fisher said we could do the 6th and that would be two weeks before Easter. Shirley Davis said get him to bring it on Friday so people can use it that weekend. Everyone agreed on the 4th through the 11th.

Sally Kerce also brought up that she and Kasia had mentioned having an Easter egg hunt again on the day before Easter, April 19th. She asked the council if they would want to do that again. Shirley Davis asked if the town would furnish the eggs. Sally Kerce said yes and hot dogs, chips and drinks. Everyone agreed on Saturday, April 19th. Turn the kids loose at 12 noon. Sally Kerce said that she would get the eggs ordered and the fire department lined up to hide them. Shirley Davis asked if anyone from the church needs to come help. Sally Kerce said any help is welcomed.

Shirley Davis mentioned that the polling place for Lyerly had been moved to the Community Center. She said that's where people need to go to vote on SPLOST. Sally Kerce said yes. Lyerly depends on SPLOST for a lot of things. Juanita Baker said that is the only tax that we have that everyone has to pay.
